

Pin Pouch Pattern

This Pattern makes one bifold "Numbered Pin Holder". The holder folds down in half and is held shut with a tied ribbon.

Materials Needed:

- *Two (2) coordinating Kaffe Fassett fabrics 5" x 7" each
- *One (1) piece batting 5 x 7"
- *One (1) ribbon 20-22" long (1/4 - 1/2 wide)

Steps:

1. On right side of outer fabric, sew on the ribbon 2 1/2" from the bottom in the center.
(The bifold will be folded down from the 7" length).
2. Stack the batting with the inner fabric on top. (Wrong side on fabric to batting side). Put the outer fabric on top (right side facing the inner fabric)
3. Pull both sides of sewn ribbon towards bottom.
4. Pin unit in place, if desired.
5. Start sewing starting from the bottom, approximately 1-1 1/2" from corner, using 1/4" seam.
6. Sew all the way around the "Numbered pin holder" stopping approximately 1" after you turn the last corner, leaving a gap to turn the holder right-side out.
7. Trim the corners diagonally, close to the seam.
8. Turn the "numbered pin holder" inside out.
9. Using a stiletto or "Purple Thang", square up the corners the best you can.
10. Press.
11. Topstitch around the pin holder (this should catch your unsewn area from where you turned it).
12. Press in half.
13. Place your numbered pins in the bottom part*** See note at bottom on how to make these.
14. Tie the ribbon shut and take it with you on the go to your next class or retreat!

Extra Numbered Pins (Pinterest tip author unknow)

~ For each pin:

One (1) corsage pin

Two (2) bead (jewelry making size 8-14mm)

One (1) Numbered bead (jewelry making size 8-14mm)

Glue (E6000)

Take a corsage pin, add a dab of glue at the head of the pin and slide a bead in place next to the top of the corsage pin.

Put the next dab of glue on the pin next to your first bead. Slide on the numbered bead and snug it up to the first bead.

Put the last dab of glue on the pin next to your numbered pin. Slide the last bead on up against the numbered bead.

LET DRY FOR AN HOUR OR TWO BEFORE YOU TEST IT ;-)

I have found that the best way to put a dab of glue on the corsage pin is to put a small dab of glue on a piece of aluminum foil, then use another corsage pin to dab the glue onto the pin you are working on.
