

Tripping Part 1 By Jen Kingwell

Finished Block measures 12" square Please read all instructions before commencing. Note * all registration marks for placement,






Make 2 blocks total

CUTTING:


- Remember when cutting a reversed template simply flip it so the right side of the template sits on your fabric.
- You might find it helpful to mark the * in the seam allowance.
- Maximise the stretch on all inner curves (concave).
- 4 of Template A (2 of each of 2 fabrics)
- 4 of Template B
- 4 of Template C and 4 in reverse. Note: *
- 4 of Template D
- 4 of Template E
- 4 of Template F and 4 in reverse. Note: *
- 4 of Template G and 4 in reverse. Note: *
- 4 of Template H and 4 in reverse. Note: *
- 4 of Template I
- 4 of Template J
- 4 of Template K and 4 in reverse. Note: *
- 8 of Template L
- 4 of Template M

ASSEMBLY:

Take the fabric cut from Template A and stitch together as follows



Next take Template B and stitch Template C and C reverse to either side




Make 4 units.








Stitch the 4 B/C units together with Template D between to create a ring.




Stitch the A unit into the centre hole.

Next take Template E and stitch a Template F and F reversed to either side



Followed by G and G reversed




Then stitch H and H reversed to the above unit










Make 4 units E – H

Join the 4 units into a ring by stitching a Template I between










Next stitch the A/B/C/D unit into the central hole.



Take Template J and stitch a Template K and K reversed to either side













Then stitch Template L to each side



Stitch Template M into the curved corner



Make 4 units

To complete the block, stitch the above corner units onto the previously stitched block.










Make 2 blocks total and stitch together side by side







Cut 23 Template N – 11 from dark and 12 from light fabric. Cut 1 and 1 reversed Template O from dark fabric. Stitch a sawtooth border



Stitch the sawtooth border to the bottom of your blocks.
